Travel through Time in the Eastern **CIRCUIT**

In the Eastern circuit are located the **Mkomazi** and the **Saadani** National Parks. These parks have an abundance of wildlife and being more remote National Parks provide a more intimate game viewing experience.



Mkomazi National Park

Being also a Rhinoceros Sanctuary makes this National Park the custodian of the rare rhino which is fast becoming extinct in Africa. The 3,270km² Mkomazi National Park (MNP) forms the southern extension of the Tsavo Ecosystem into north-eastern Tanzania, and together with Tsavo National Park in Kenya it forms one of the largest protected areas in Africa.



Saadani National Park

Located on the [Indian Ocean](#) coast some 45km north of [Bagamoyo](#) and directly west of [Zanzibar](#). This park is full of indigenous bird-species and big mammals like elephants, herds of buffalos and numerous groups of hippos and crocodiles. It s also possible, if you are lucky, to see elephants on the beach.



Pangani

Historical side

This historical site owes its name to The **Pangani** river, that goes north through the town to the **Indian Ocean**. Its architecture reminds one of the strong Arabic, German and British colonial influence in **Tanzania**. It is believed, this town was established before the 6th century BC as a coastal dhow port, but later it became a station on the caravan route from **Lake Tanganyika** for exporting slaves and ivory.



Bagamoyo

Founded by the end of the 18th century, Bagamoyo is the oldest town in Tanzania, it was the original capital of German East Africa and one of the most important trading ports along the East African coast.

Today Bagamoyo has a population of 30,000 and is the capital of the District of Bagamoyo. It is also under consideration for a [Unesco World Heritage Site](#).
