ITINERARY

Pickup at 8:00am from your hotel or the airport and then we visit the following:

TANZANIA NATIONAL MUSEUM

Our City Tour starts at the National Museum where you can see historical items from the slave trade, European exploration, German occupation and British colonization as well as the significant archeological findings of the fossils of Zinjathropus, Stone Age tools and traditional arts and crafts from different Tanzanian tribes.

BOTANICAL GARDEN

Next, we head to the Botanical Garden which were established by the Germans in 1906 and are still vibrant with colorful flowers and interesting plants. After a short break at the garden we'll continue, passing through State House and on to the Fish Market by ferry.

FISH MARKET

The fish market is full of life, starting at dawn every day when local fishermen deliver their catch. This is a colorful introduction to the bustling life of the city.

ASKARI MONUMENT

This monument was erected in 1927 as a memorial for African troops who fought for their country in the World War One.

MNAZI MMOJA PARK:

This is a beautiful park near the city center and home to the symbolic Uhuru Torch Monument which was built to celebrate Tanzania's independence in 1961.

MWALIMU NYERERE CULTURAL CENTRE - NYUMBA YA SANAA (ART HOUSE)

The 'Art House' or Mwalimu Nyerere Cultural Centre was established in 1983 by the Catholic Church. It displays traditional arts and crafts which are mostly made by women and people with disability.

MAKUMBUSHO VILLAGE (VILLAGE MUSEUM)

Makumbusho memorial village is created from authentically constructed dwellings from the different areas and tribes of Tanzania. The village often holds traditional dances called Ngoma and other cultural activities.

MWENGE ART MARKET

From Makumbusho Village we'll head to Mwenge Market where local people sell their art crafts and the Tinga Tinga Art gallery. Most of the artworks are made at the gallery and it offers a wide selection of handcrafted pottery, paintings, jewelry, and carvings on display and for sale.

KARIAKOO MARKET

Drive back to the city through the famous Kariakoo Market. Kariakoo is the main market in Dar es Salaam and sells exotic fresh produce, handicrafts, local textiles and many other locally made products.

In the afternoon you will stop for lunch at City Garden Restaurant before we drive you back to the airport or your hotel.
