





## Gombe Stream National Park

Tanzania's smallest park, a mountainous strip bordering the **Lake Tanganyika**, it covers just 56sq km. This park offers the chance to observe the **chimpanzee** communities made famous by the British explorer **Jane Goodall**. This area is very forested, due to this habitat its rare to see carnivores, is the perfect place for walking and bird watching.





## Mahale Mountains National Park

Covering an area of approximately 1.600sq Km, the park's western side is the shore of **Lake Tanyanika**. Home to a wild population of **chimpanzees** which maybe observed in their natural habitat in groups of up to 30. Different species of primates, big mamals like buffalos, lions and smaller animals like porcupine and 250 species of fish in **Tanyanica**, are the life of this National Park.



## Rubondo Island National Park

This island is known for its diversity, being located in a corner of **Lake Victoria** north-west of Mwanza with a wide variety of habitats ranging from savannah to open woodland, dense forest, papyrus swamps and sandy beaches. This island is full of life with a great variety of mammals, carnivores and herbivores, birds and reptiles.
